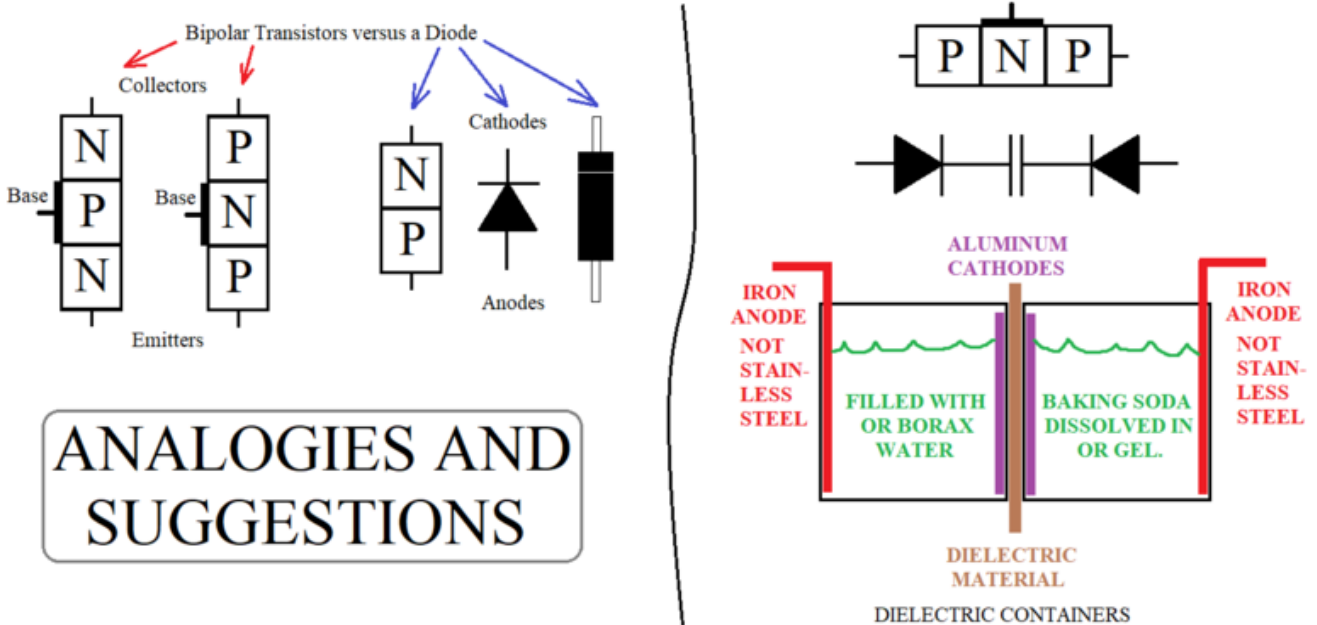

Maybe capacitance could be added to a diode by using two diodes whose cathodes are facing (connected to) each other?
